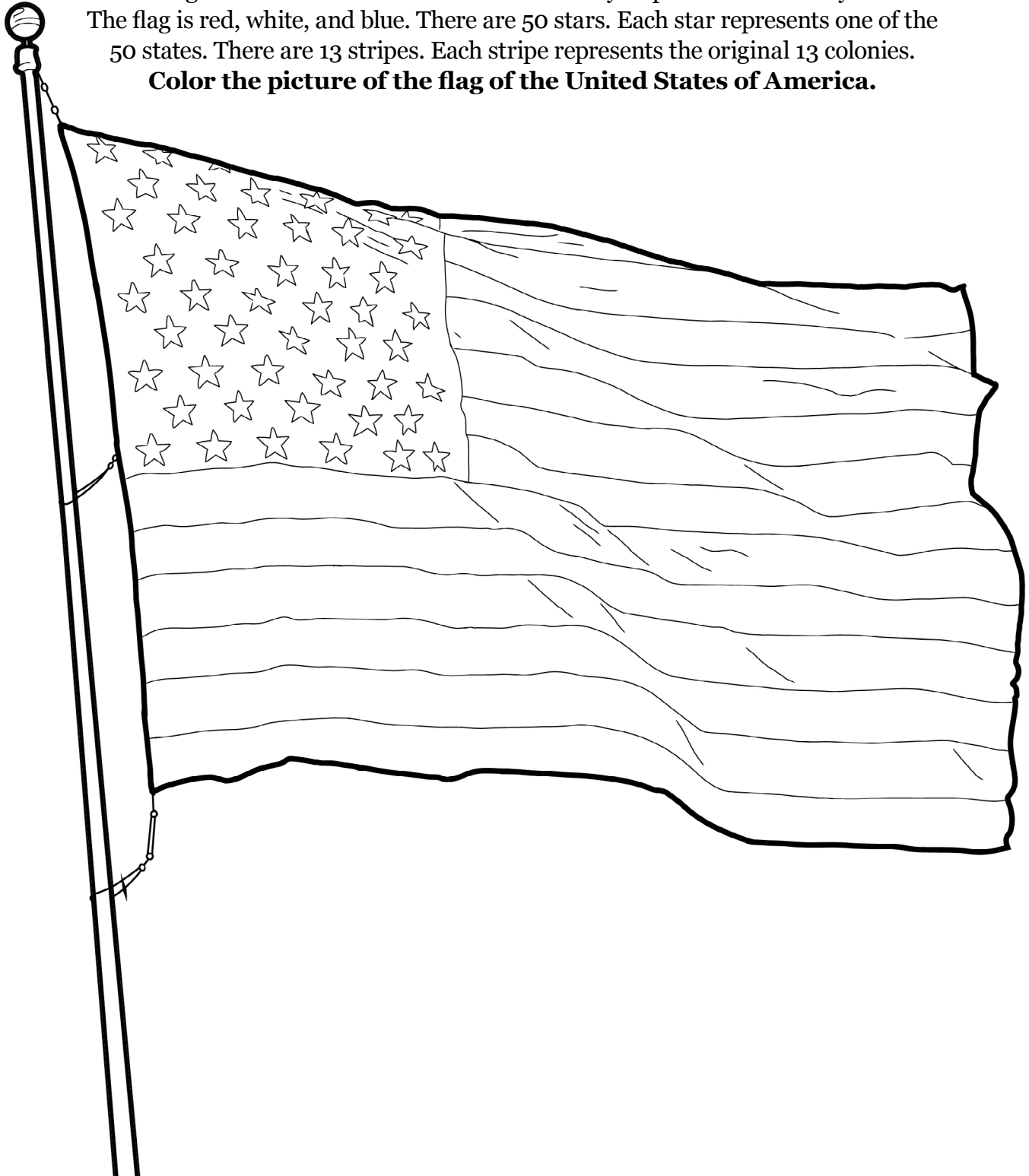

The Flag of the United States of America

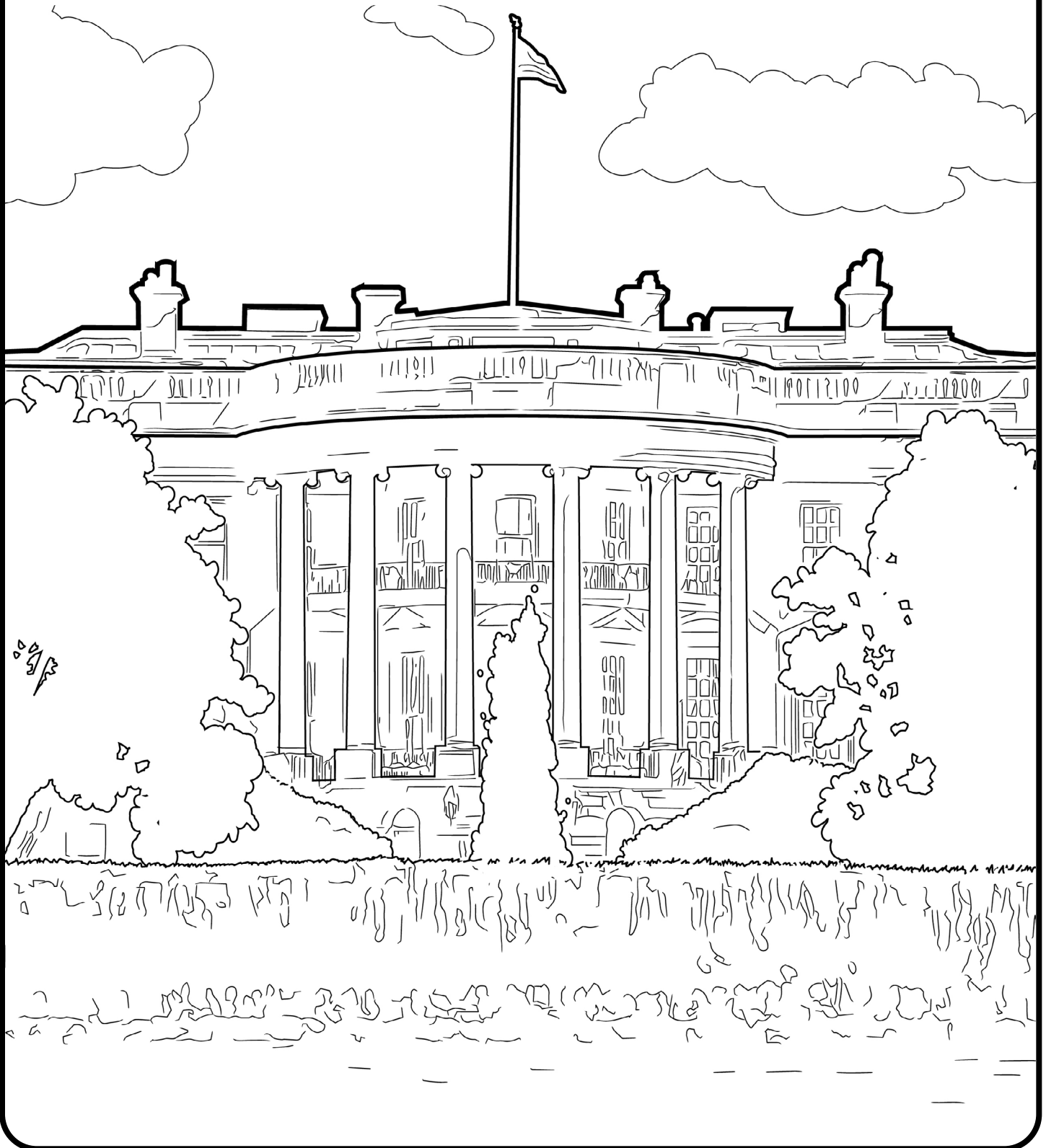

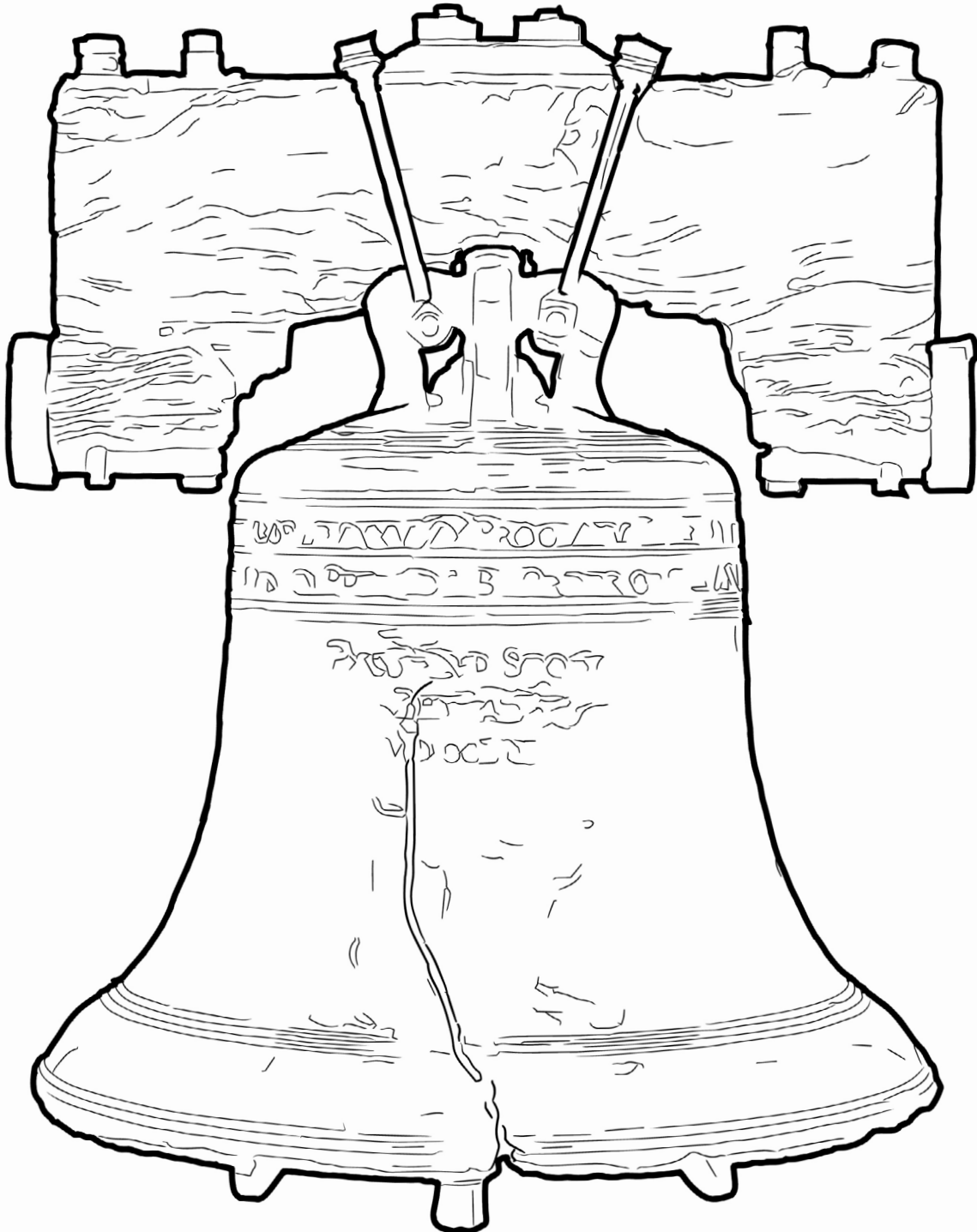

The Liberty Bell

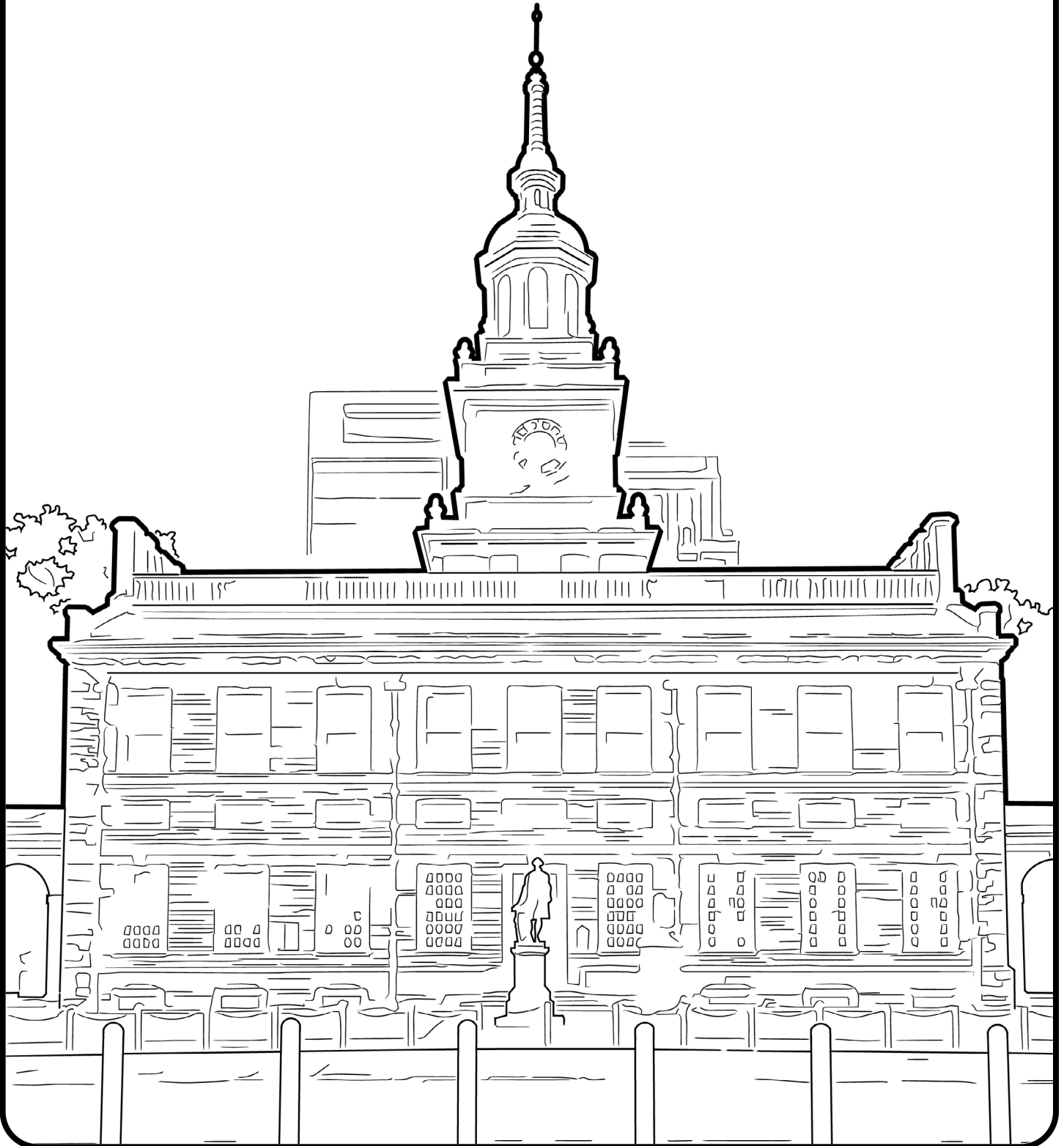

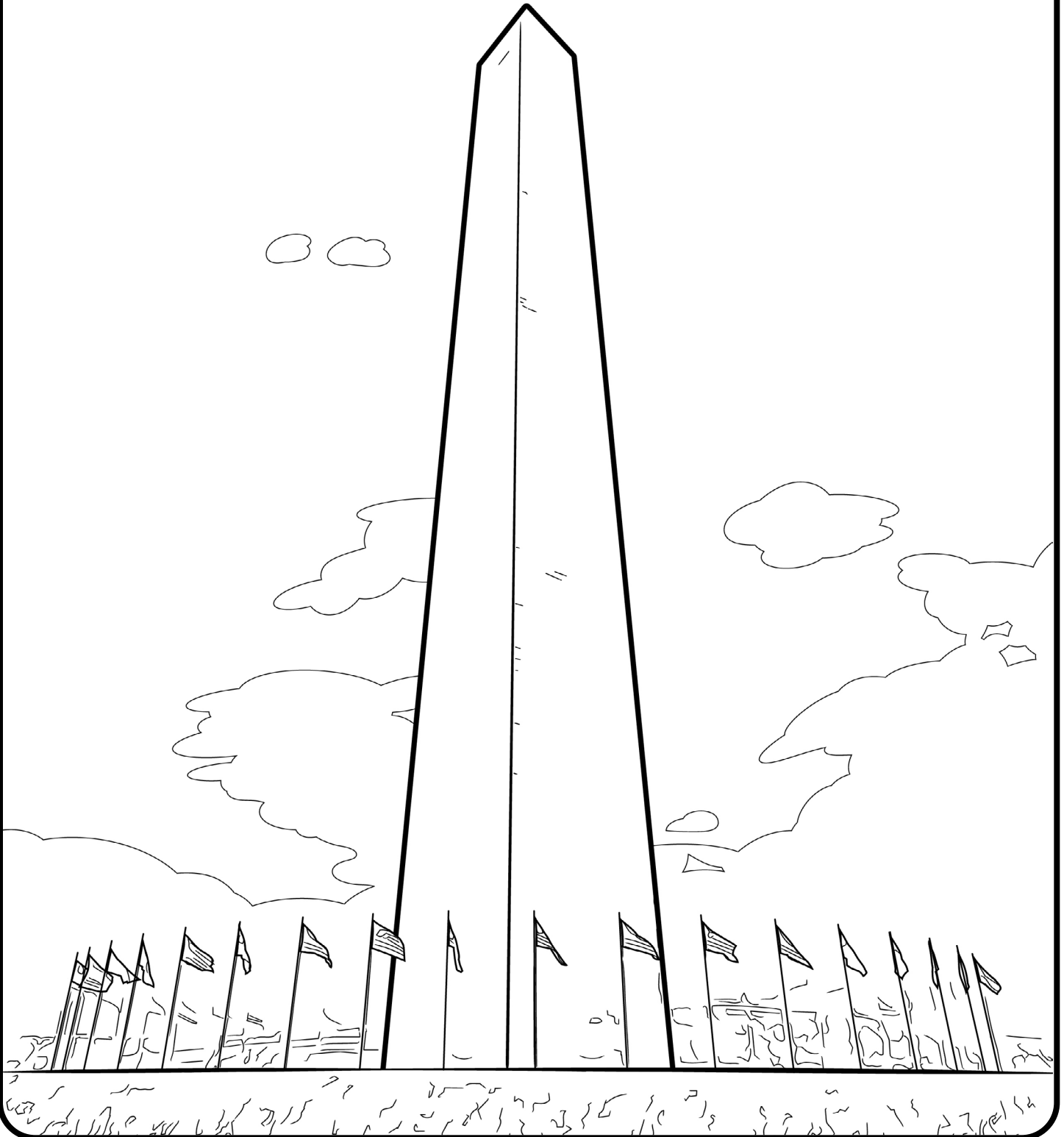


The Washington Monument

The Washington Monument honors our first president, George Washington.

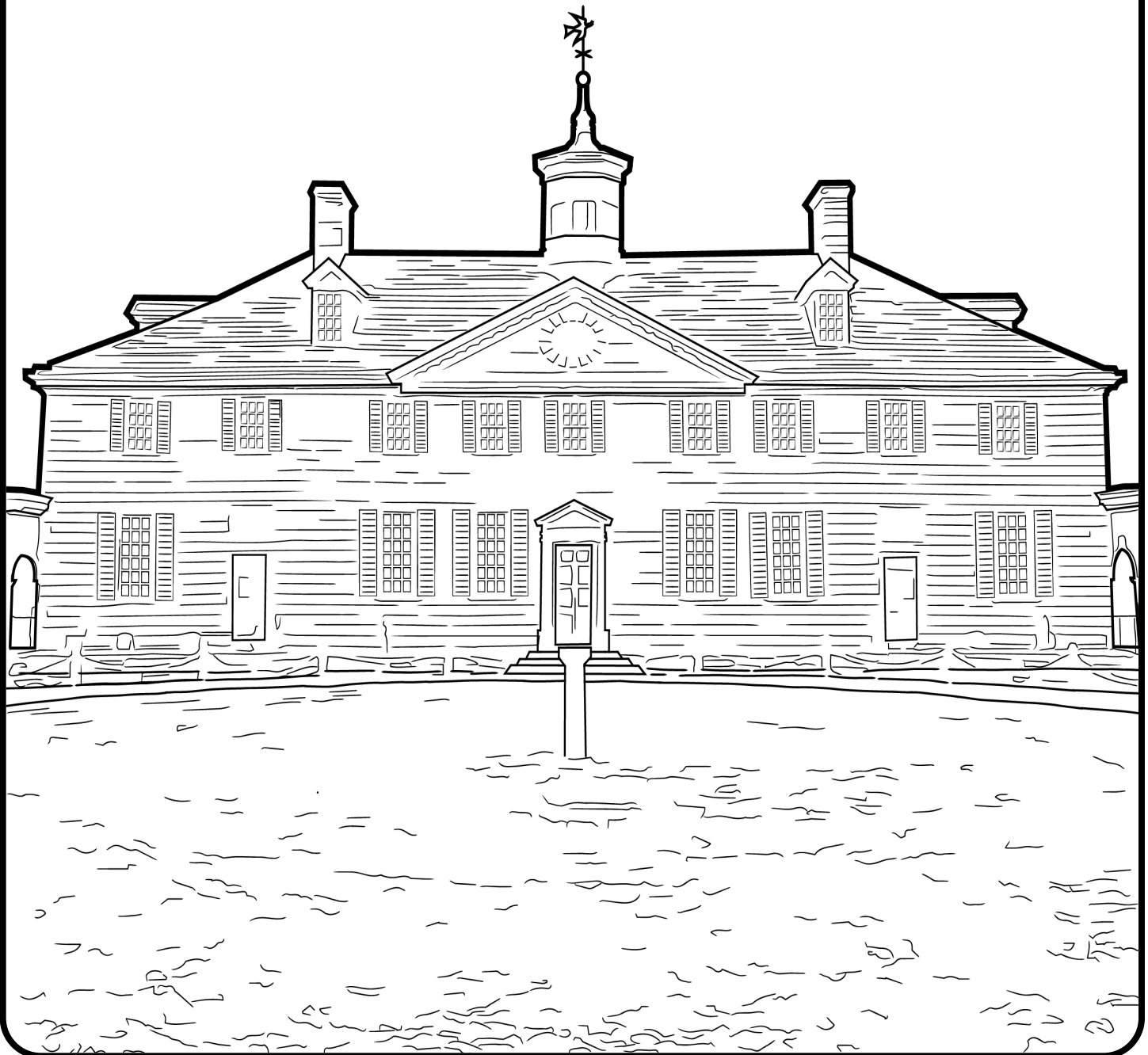

Mount Vernon is the name of George Washington's house. He lived here with his wife Martha. Mount Vernon is in Virginia. Virginia was one of the first 13 states.

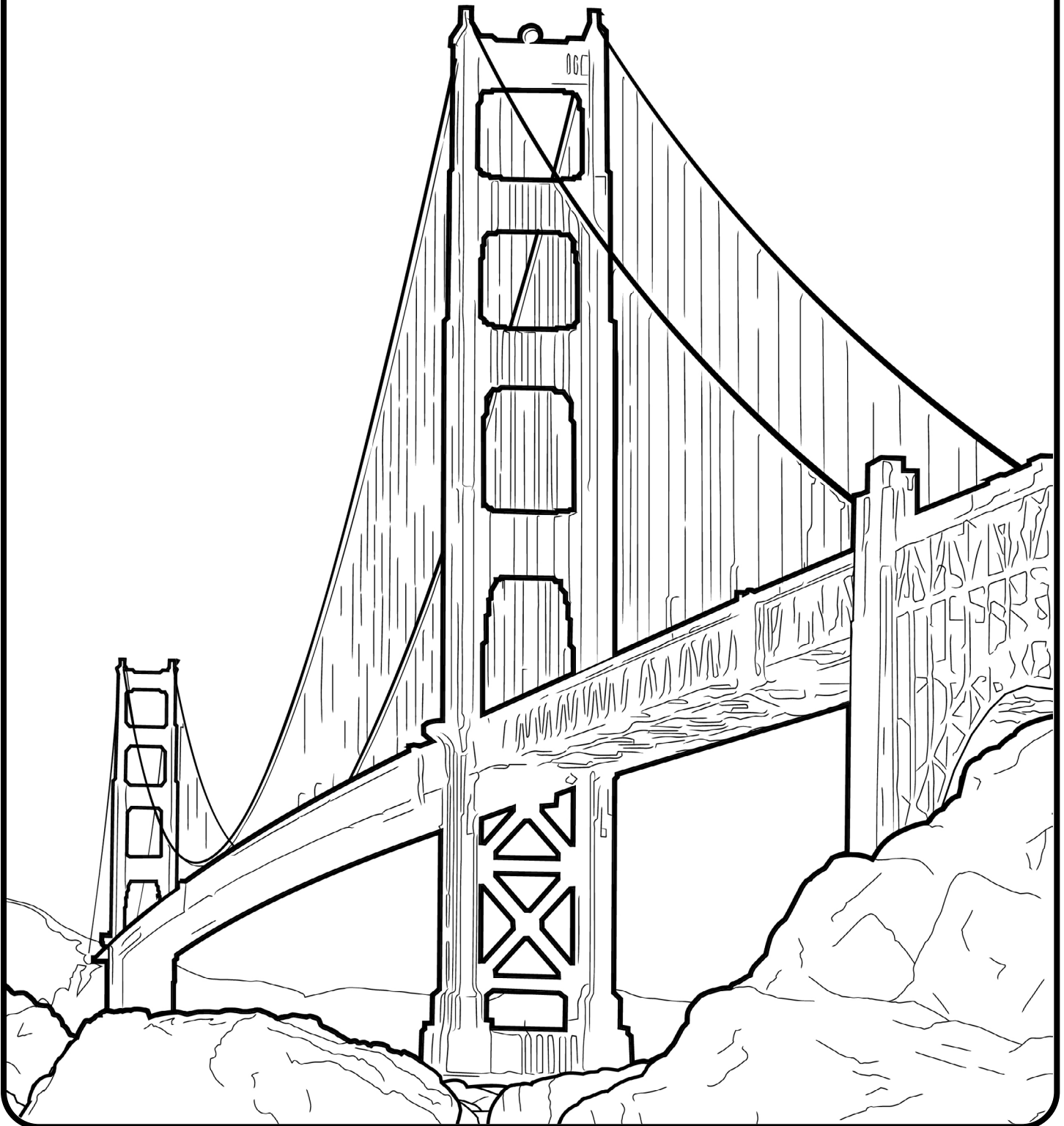

The Golden Gate Bridge

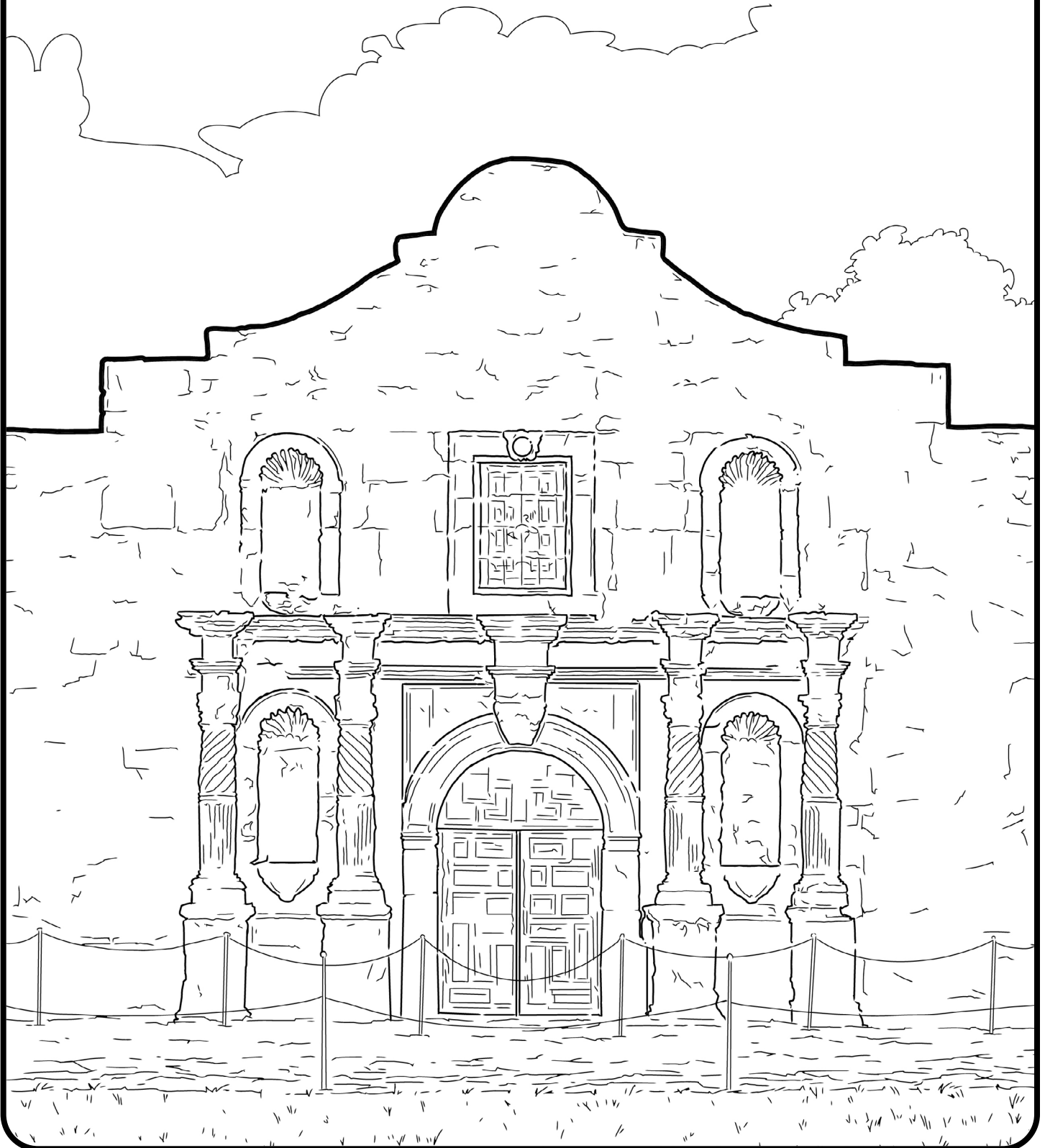

The Empire State Building

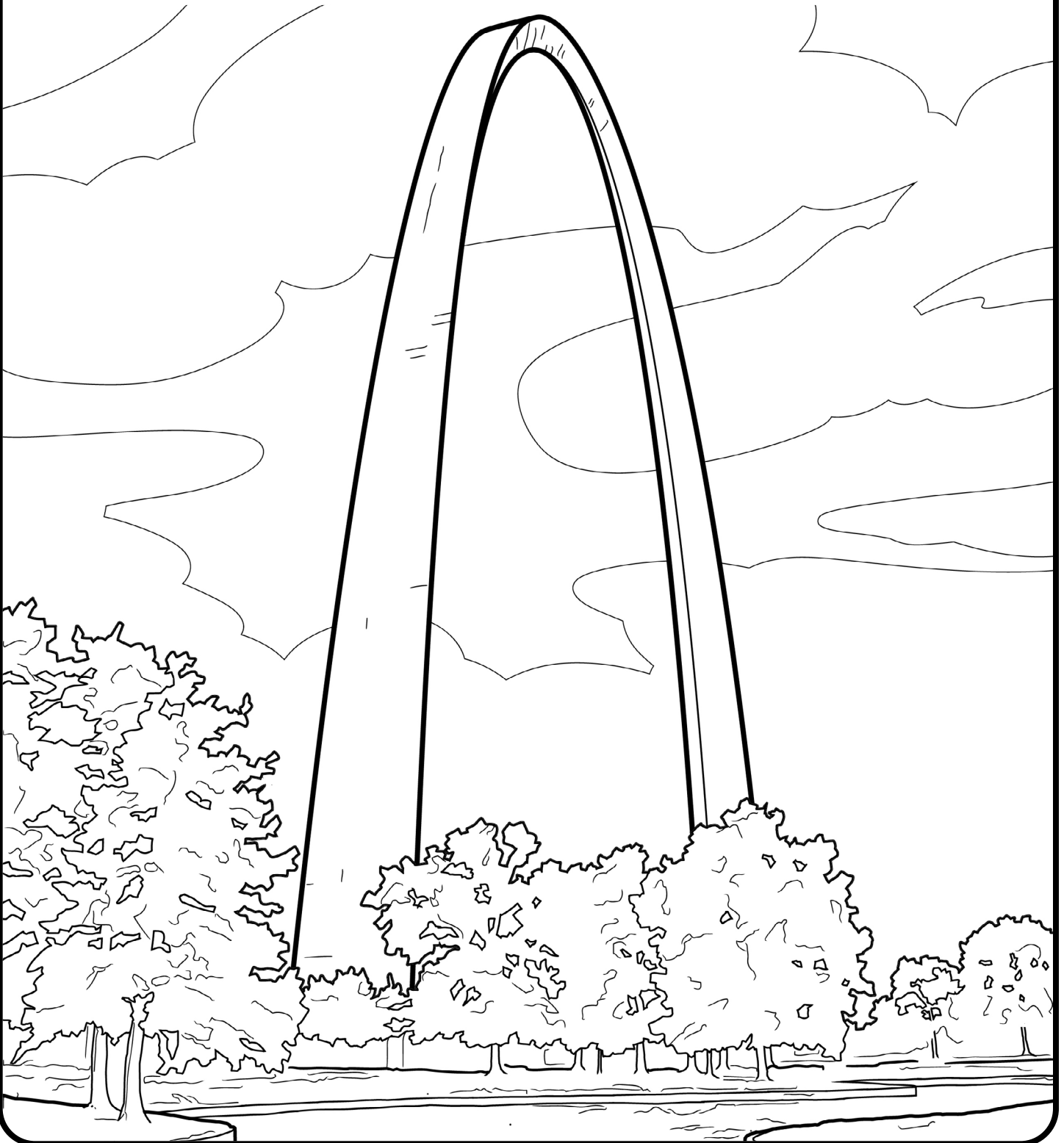

The Gateway Arch

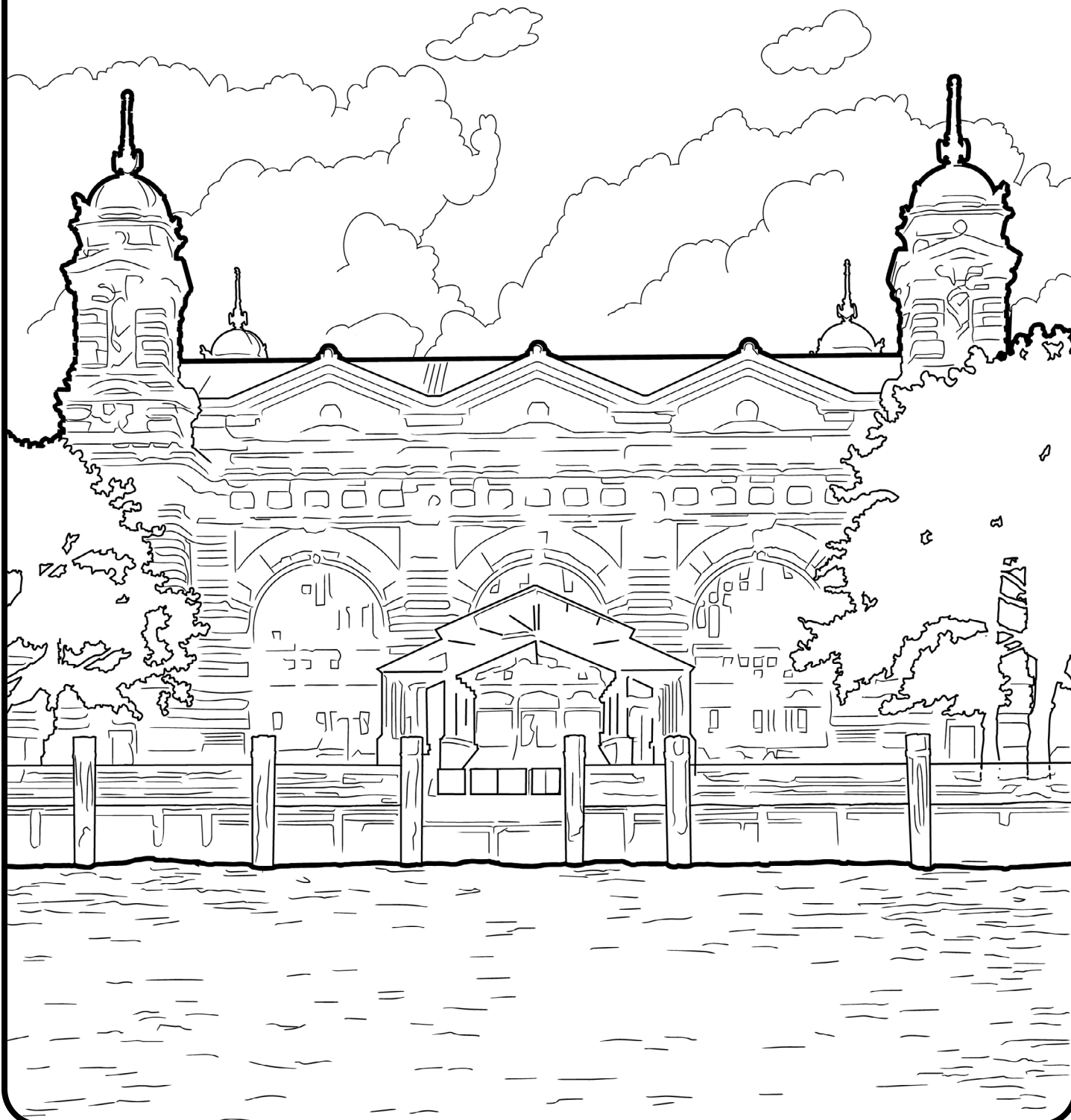
The Gateway Arch is in St. Louis, Missouri. "St." is an abbreviation for "Saint."

The Statue of Liberty

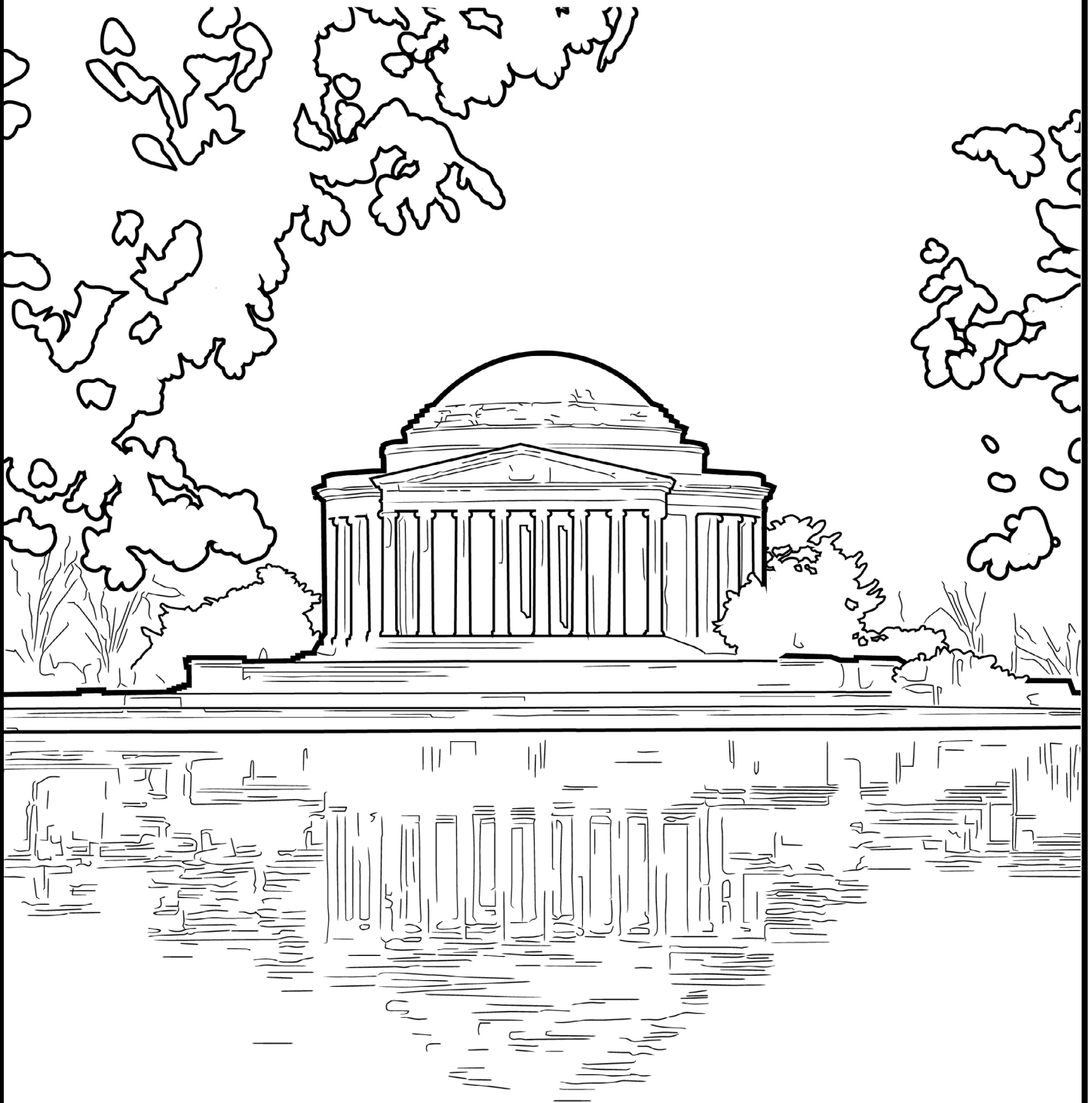

Thomas Jefferson was the second president of the United States. His memorial is in Washington, District of Columbia, the capital of the United States.

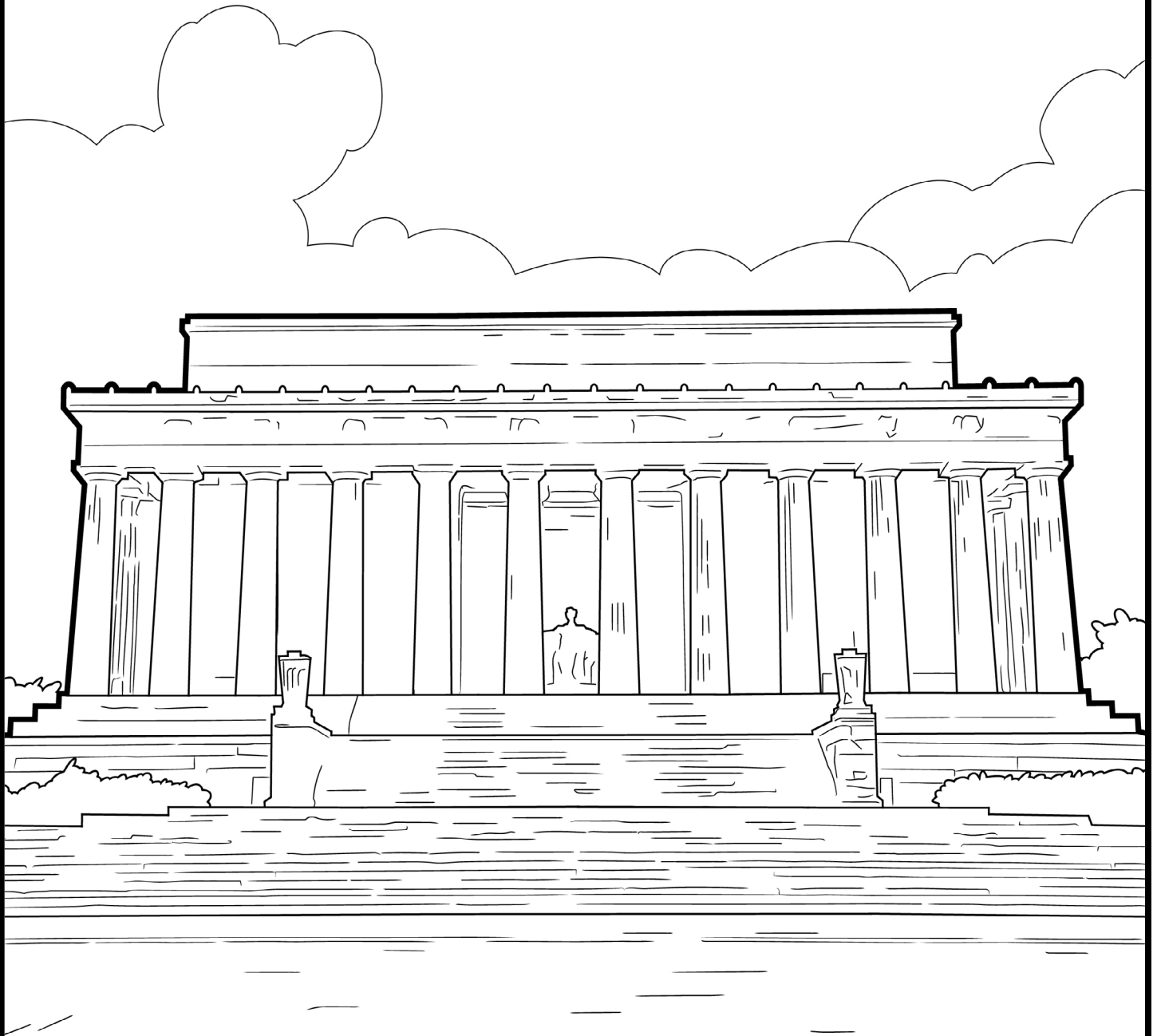

Color the picture of the Lincoln Memorial.



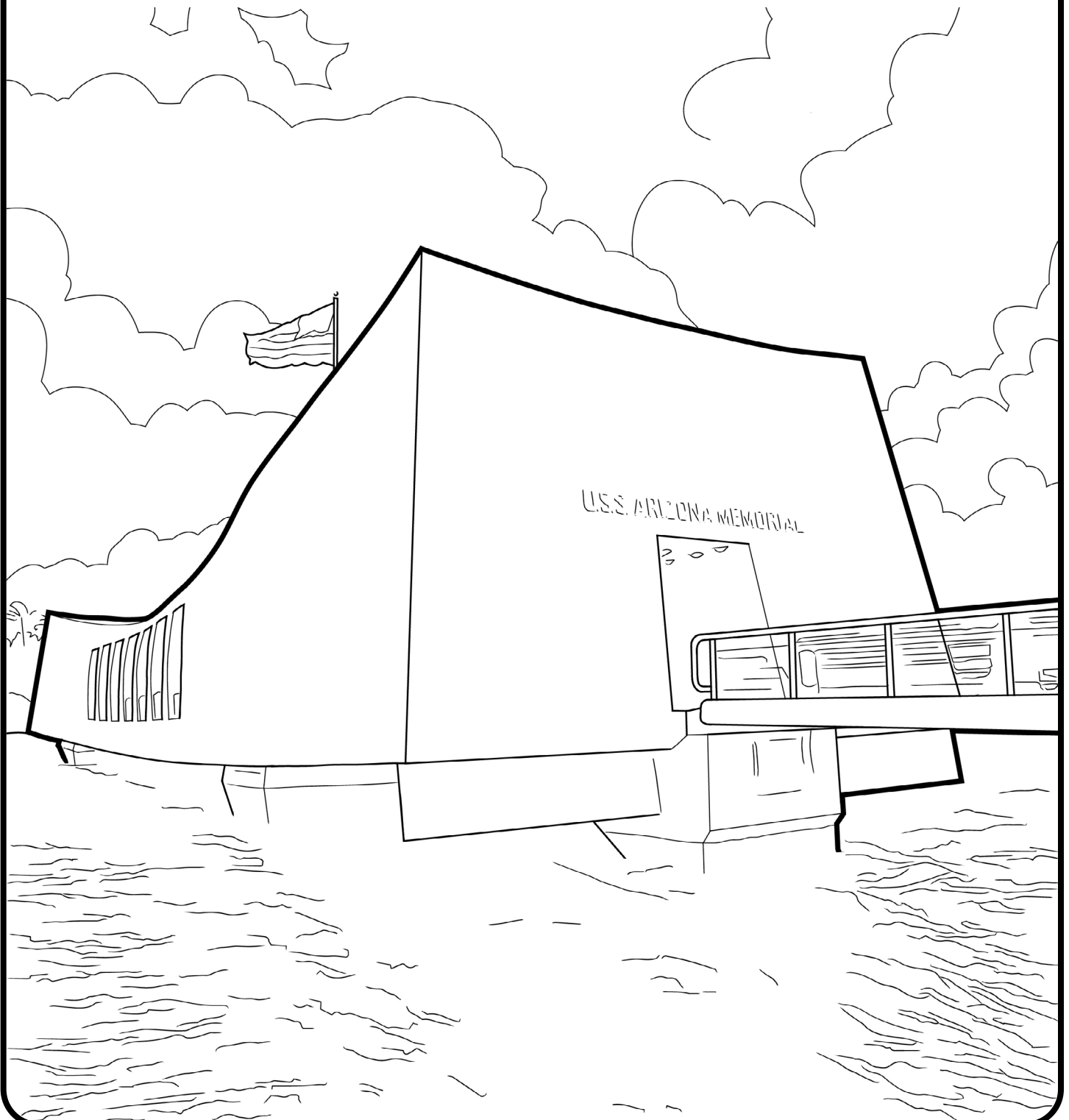
Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial

USS Arizona Memorial

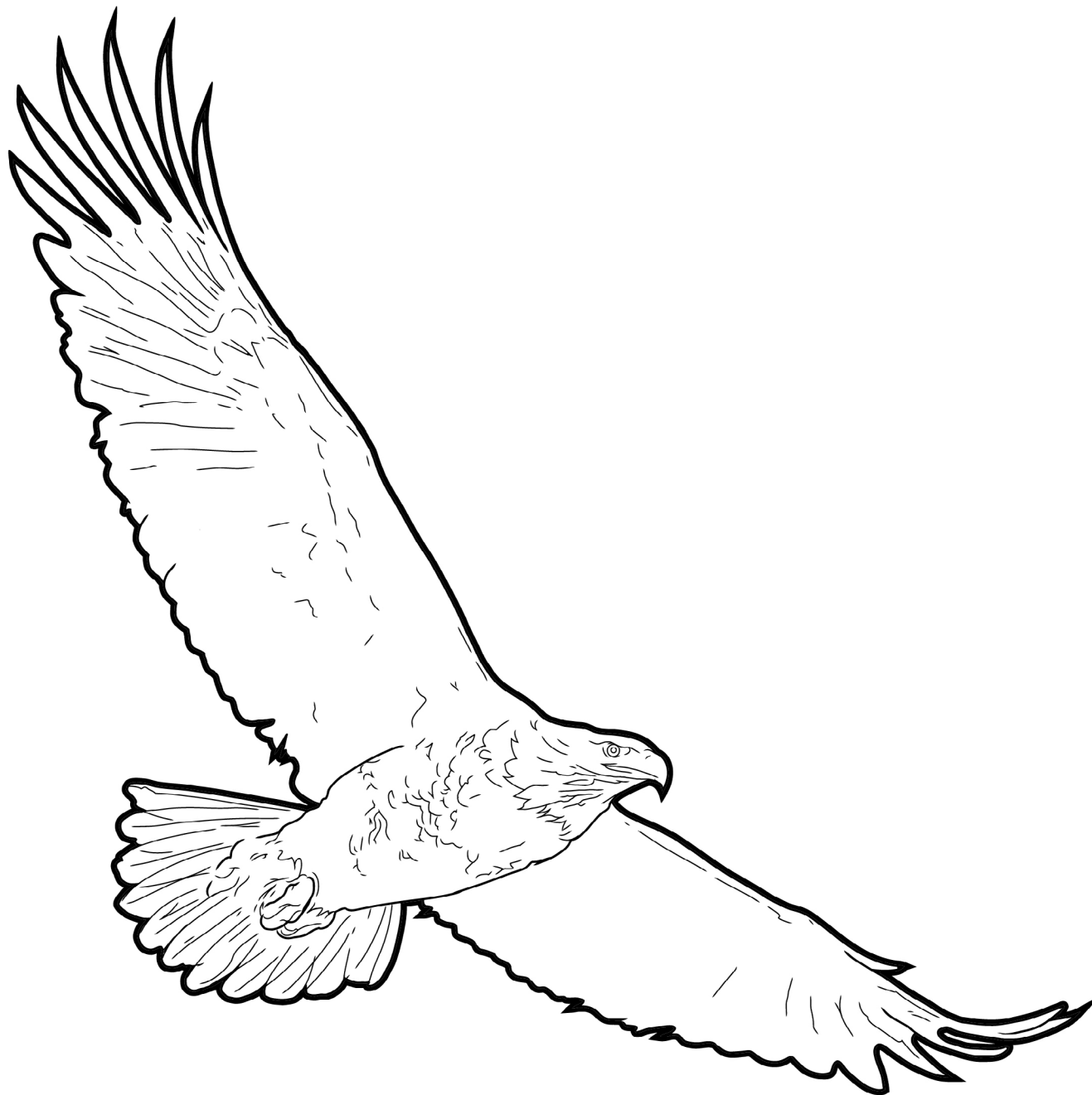
