- I, Katherine E. Woods, being duly sworn, depose and say:
- 1. That I am an attorney duly licensed in the State of Arkansas and employed by William N. Carter, P.A., with offices at 2311 Biscayne Drive, Suite 320, Little Rock, Arkansas.
- 2. That the petition to classify Andrew Roy Gibb p/k/a "Andy Gibb" as a third preference alien (I-140), to which this Affidavit is attached, was prepared by me at the request of the alien beneficiary and the petitioner, R.S.O. Records, Inc.
- 3. That the alien is an exclusive recording artist for R.S.O. Records, Inc., 8335 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, a major international record label.
- 4. That the alien is exclusively represented by the William Morris Agency, Inc., 1350 Avenue of the Americas, New York, New York, one of the world's largest theatrical employment agencies, in the television and concert fields.
- 5. That the Robert Stigwood Organisation, 1775 Broadway, New York, New York, is one of the world's largest entertainment companies and is the manager of the alien with respect to his professional career.
- 6. That the alien recorded a song entitled "I Just Want To Be Your Everything", which was released by R.S.O. Records, Inc., and which climbed to the #1 position on the charts in the three leading trade periodicals, Billboard, Cashbox, and Record World, and remained in the top ten for sixteen (16) weeks.
- 7. That the aforementioned song was certified gold by the Recording Industry Association of America (R.I.A.A.) on August 9, 1977, i.e., one-half million copies were sold as of the date of certification.

To Appear At Walks Andy Gibb Urges, "Let's Go to the Moon"

HOLLYWOOD—A young star shooting to the top of the entertainment world like a rocket going to the moon is the Superstar of the 1978 KFRC 610-March of Dimes Superwalk to the Moon and Back.

He's Andy Gibb, younger brother of the famous singing group, the Bee Gees, Andy's new album Flowing Rivers is selling like hotcakes, and fans everywhere are just melting to his hit single, I Just Want to Be Your Everything.

As Superstar of the Superwalk, Andy will make appearances along the routes of each of the nine walks on Superwalk Saturday, April 1, to greet walkers and encourage them to complete their 32 kilometer courses.

It will be the biggest and longest walk in Bay Area history when waikers step out in pursuit of a collective distance of 740,972 kilometers. That is twice the exact distance to the earth's nearest satellite in space on Superwalk Saturday.

9 'Lift-Off' Sites: Get Sponsors and Win Big Prizes

Superwalkers fasten sneakers. Countdown nears zero. Breathe deeply. We have lift off!

Be a part of that scene Saturday April 1. Thousands in the Bay Area will step out on the first Superwalk to the Moon and Back. Simultaneous lift off will be from nine "launch sites" in six counties when walkers of 32 kilometer routes go for a collective distance of 740,972 kilometers.

Starts will be at 8 a.m. from the cities of Alameda, Fairfield, Oakland, Pleasant Hill, Pleasanton, Redwood City, San Francisco, Santa Rosa and Vacaville. (Some trajectories also cross Albany, Berkeley, Dublin, Livermore and Pledmont.)

Registration at each site begins an hour earlier at 7 a.m. Walkers should bring their filled-in sponsor forms. You will receive, Superwalk validation cards showing routes and checkpoints.

You can begin signing up sponsors immediately, following details on forms. Some of the fabulous prizes described in other stories are awarded on the basis of funds obtained from sponsors and deposited on or before May 1. The real winners will be present and future kids who benefit from research and other March of Dimes programs to fight birth defects.

All March of Dimes offices, schools, McDonald's restaurants, Holiday Ims, and most park and recreation departments have sponsor forms. For added details call the number listed on page 4 next to the walk location nearest you.

Simultaneous "lift-off" from nine locations in Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Solano and Sonoma countles will be at 8 a.m. Saturday, April 1.

"We're going to fool everyone that day and show what the young people can do for less fortunate kids," said Dr. Don Rose, popular KFRC 610 radio personality. He is chairman of this year's event.

To achieve the goal of a lunar roundtrip, said Dr. Don, will require thousands upon thousands of walkers to take collectively this "giant step for mankind."

Each walker will set out on a 32-kilometer course. (That's 20 miles to folks who haven't gone metric yet.) Funds come from sponsors obtained by walkers for each kilometer marched. A minimum pledge of 10 cents per kilometer is requested, but in the past many sponsors have proved much more generous, often surpassing \$1 for each kilometer walked.

Dr. Don said all proceeds of the Superwalk to the Moon will go to the March of Dimes battle against birth defects. Every two minutes, some child in this country is born with physical or mental damage. That's 250,000 babies a year who don't enjoy the benefit of a healthy birth.

Besides walking to help others who can't walk or have some other defect, and to support research to prevent such defects from happening in the future, Superwalkers will have plently of other incentives. An amazing array of glamorous prizes topped by a week in







GROWING UP-WITH THE BEE GEES! *

From the time he first began his musical career, Andy Gibb has constantly been asked "How does it feel following in the footsteps of The Bee Gees?" While he sometimes gets tired of being compared to his multitalented older brothers and wants very much to be accepted as an artist in his own right, Andy, when talking about his brothers and their impact on him, says seriously, "I have very big shoes to fiil!"

While there was talk at one time of Andy becoming the fourth Bee Gee, Andy says at the time it was being discussed Barry, Maurice and Robin were in the midst of a tour and there was no time to get together and practice. By the time the subject came up again, Andy had already decided to give it a go as a solo singer.

Andy was born in Manchester, United Kingdom in 1958. It was while the family was still in Manchester that Barry, Maurice and Robin first began getting into music. Twins Robin and Maurice were only seven at the time. They picked their name in 1958, the year baby Andy was born. Their father, a bandleader moved the family to Australia and The Bee Gees began performing in clubs. Their father, according to Robin, didn't push them into show business, but once he saw their interest and talent, he threw himself behind them abandoning his own career. Barry and the twins quit school and got serious about what they loved best-music.

In 1962, the brothers signed with a major Australian record label cutting their first records at ages 15 and 13. Over the next four years they released a

dozen Bee Gees singles and a greatest hits album. Nothing much happened until 1966 when The Bee Gees decided to leave Australia for England. They were on the ship to England when they received word that their single "Spicks and Specks" was a chart topper but they had already set their sights on England, so they didn't go back.

Within days after their arrival in England the brothers signed with Robert Stigwood and the rest is now history. Within five weeks they released a single "New York Mining Disaster." That single and the next three all released in 1967 went Top 15 in the U.S. and a score of other countries as well. By the end of the year The Bee Gees, not yet 20, were major stars.

Growing up with The Bee Gees as brothers had its good and bad points, says Andy. Witnessing their fantastic musicianship and ability as singer/ songwriters was thrilling.

Andy can recall getting together with his brothers and harmonizing.

"Especially when we lived in Spain," he says. "I started to take more of an interest in music and my brothers began to take notice of it and we started getting together more."

Andy can recall not having an easy time with his peers, however, because he was the brother of The Bee Gees. It was a little like being the brother of The Beatles at the time. After Andy quit school at 14, dealing with jealous schoolmates ceased to be a problem.

The Bee Gees were not always models of brotherly devotion, however. In 1969, they spilt

up and went their separate ways, none of them achieving much success on his own.

"We weren't cut out to be solo stars," Barry says. "Somebody in his almighty wisdom knew that, whether we did or not." Finally the brothers ironed out their problems, to the relief of Robert Stigwood and the Gibb family. A steady stream of smash hits followed ushering them into their now popular disco phase. With the exception of Robin, all the Gibbs live in Miami now.

Andy admits that his own strongest musical influence has been his brothers. It is a thrill for him collaborating with Barry on songs. (Barry wrote "I Just Want To Be Your Everything" and "Love Is Thicker Than Water.")

Andy can't explain how songwriting comes so easily to him and his brothers. For the Gibbs, writing songs is almost like writing postcards except that whatever they write inevitably becomes a smash hit!


There's one more Gibb left and that's young sister Berri, 13.


ROCKET: Are your songs personal statements on love?

As a teenager, Money played in the "Battle Of The Bands" competitions, and was briefly part of a band called the Music Machine that had a semi-hit, "Talk, Talk."

Now approaching 30, Eddie Money is into California "drought rock." One of his latest songs is called "Cimme Some Water." "Everybody 86

in California," Money says, "is looking for water. It's so fucking dry."

His debut LP, released recently was produced under the most trying circumstances. First, his closest friend died during production (the album is dedicated to him); and then the guitar player came down with a dose of the clap, that caused one of his hands to curl into a claw. So every fifteen minutes during the recording sessions, he had to dip the hand in a vat of hot water.

Columbia, however, is getting solidly behind Money, and between the voice lessons, the touring, and the press interviews, he is getting his first taste of life at the top. "It's fucking great, man," he says.

my own performance. Even today I don't ke what I did on it. I did one g with Barry, "Thicker Than Water" which I thought was good. And "Everything" I thought would be a hit.

ROCKET: Did you ever consider using a pseudonym, the way Michael Mc-Cartney became Michael McGear? GIBB: I don't know, I feel it's important to take advantage of what is there. It's important to be established and get some roots going. Once you're on your own you can really do something. My brothers are helping me—I admit they're helping me— ROCKET: Do you get much advice? GIBB: I generally play my songs to Barry or my other brothers and they tell me what they think. They never try to tell me not to bother with it or something like that. They tell me the good points. They help me with decisions, with their experience.

ROCKET: Growing up with them, did you always want to be a singer too? GIBB: When I was about twelve I used to show jump alot, horse riding. I had my own two horses and I was

getting into competitions. I wasn't sure what I wanted to do at that point. I sang and liked music. As I got older and went on tours I knew that was what I wanted to do.

ROCKET: When did you feel you were ready to record?

GIBB: I was 16 at the time. I spent a few years in Australia. You can get to the top in Australia and never get heard outside the country which is a shame. I had a record out there. ROCKET: How do you cope with a sudden burst of fame?

GIBB: I just try to keep my head together, keep level headed about it. Keep on going. It's been incredible, it really has.

ROCKET: You're a special type of star—the sort who will get the very enthusiastic fans. Are you besieged? GIBB: Yes, but luckily they don't know where I live! I don't have any hassles with people coming around. But phone calls all the time. I pick up the phone and either they hang up, or they giggle. Giggling for a few minutes. It goes on all the time even into the early hours of the morning. I usually get it worse on tour. That's when it becomes unbearable.

ROCKET: And on stage?

GIBB: They worry me sometimes. They get so much emotion inside them. Crying. It's emotional to see them from the stage. It's hard to sing and watch them at the same time. To see kids at that age crying—that much broken up over a concert—it makes me feel pretty strange. They lose their mind and get hysterical—it's really frightening sometimes.



Profile: ANDY GIBB

It is not exceptional for the youngest member of a musically gifted family to follow in the footsteps of his older brothers. It is uncommon in the case of Andy Gibb however, to grow up the brother of the prestigious Bee Gees, and yet develop a style so distinct and uniquely his. It is equally uncommon for anyone at this stage of his life to possess a talent so mature. Andy's striking presence combines both the romance of youth and the confidence of sophisticated musical creativity. His sensitive lyrics and unpretentious manner convey a charm that will steal every young girl's heart. At the same time, his tightly woven arrangements and country-rock style express the self-assured savvy of a musician whose career has finally begun to take its turn.

It would be safe to assume that Andy's extraordinary background has made some contribution to his precocious development. The path that his life has taken is hardly the usual one. In fact, one could easily say that Andy has journeyed in his brief eighteen years, distances that many of us will not cover in a lifetime. Although born in Manchester, United Kingdom in 1958, his family moved to Australia while Andy was still very young. He returned to

the United Kingdom in 1967 at the age of nine, and picked up his first guitar. Between the years of 1970 and 1974 Andy's adventures led him to the remote island of Ibiza off the coast of Spain, and eventually to the Isle of Man. Having played in a few clubs during his travels, he began to play professionally when back in the United Kingdom. After a few local gigs, he confidently chose Australia to be the proving ground of his career; and with a keen sense of determination Andy returned there in 1975. Playing his own material as well as old Bee Gees numbers, Andy formed a group that toured all over the country, taking billings with groups like Sweet and The Bay City Rollers.

One might easily get the impression that Andy would be jaded by such good fortune- but he is not one to stand back and let life come to him. On the contrary, anyone who has met Andy immediately recognizes the vitality with which he embraces every experience. Indeed, each song he writes reveals the importance he attaches to what is otherwise a fleeting moment. The profound feeling of Andy's songs is rarely seen in any writer, let alone one of eighteen. After finally recording some of his material in Australia, there was no question that he was more than ready to put together his first album. Robert Stigwood was quick to appreciate his ability and they signed a recording and management contract in 1976.

Signing with Robert Stigwood had set into motion a

wave of events that carried Andy's career still one step further. Firstly, there was a reunion with his brother Barry who he had not seen in several years. Never before was Andy able to relate to his brother on equal ground as a proven musician with an identity all his own. It was an exhilarating experience for each of them, both personally and professionally, and together they headed for the recording studio in Miami. There, at Criteria Studios, with Barry assisting the production, Andy recorded two songs which they wrote together, along with eight others he had written himself. The momentum which had begun when Andy left Australia continued as he started his work at Criteria. The country-rock feel which characterized his music, has been expanded with a sophisticated rhythm and blues quality. With guitar and keyboards predominating in most songs, Andy's vocals take on an evocative and mesmerizing nature which draws the listener into his sensitive lyrics and compelling rhythms.

Andy's album entitled, "Flowing Rivers" will be released by RSO Records in the near future. Andy Gibb is a musician whose talents coincide with the high standards of other artists on the RSO Records roster. The company's main concern is to develop themselves as a unique and selective label, and regard Andy as a fresh and inspiring addition to their company. The Brothers Johnson, who headlined, got off to a slow start as they opened with a tepid instrumental and followed with one of their slower numbers. "Land Of Ladies." It was not until the band's third number, "Dancin And Prancin," that it began to play up to its potential.

They still have a way to go as showmen, but as musicians the Brothers Johnson have few peers. Bassist Louis Johnson plays in an aggressive but tasteful manner which shows influences of Stanley Clarke, Jack Cassidy and



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Chuck Rainey. Louis Johnson's intense stage presence also makes him the band's most commanding visual attraction.

Brother George is an interesting guitarist and a competent vocalist. Trombonist Kenny Pickens and trumpeter Bobby Rodriguez comprise a strong and creative two-man horn section. The rhythm section plays cohesively and the vocal is tight.

The 10-song 55-minute set was brought to a frantic close with "I'll Be Good To You." the band's first gold single, and "Get The Funk Outta Me Face." the group's best rocker. For these two numbers the band was joined by the Floaters, who provided vocal support, and Michael Jackson, who jumped around amd made young girls scream.

In its portion of the show, the Floaters displayed good voices, excellent and energetic choreography, a good band and no creativity. The group's chart topping single, "Float On." was the only song in the 10-song set which was not previously recorded by someone else. The 45 minute set was as slick and professional as possible, but with no material of its own The Floaters will have trouble sustaining its early success.

ANDY GIBB

Roxy, Los Angeles

The 19-year-old Gibb, with a No. 1 record already under his belt, used his Sept. 8, one-hour, 10-song set to display why he is on the verge of becoming a major recording star.

With a sound distinctly reminiscent of his Bee Gee brothers, Gibb opened with the title cut from his debut RSO album "Flowing Rivers;" an upbeat lyrical tune which induced a dreamy mood into the opening night music industry crowd.

The boyishly good-looking Gibb assumed a confident stage presence, smiling to the appreciative audience as he whirled through tunes from his EP.

In between the melodic upbeat and mid-

tempo songs, he injected soothing ballads and laments, with "Starlight" being the most compeling. For two numbers, his five-piece backup band departed the stage, allowing him the spotlight on two ballads as he strummed an acoustic guitar.

Talent In Action

Among the more memorable songs of his set were "Thicker Than Water," which will be the followup single to "I Just Want To Be Your Everything": "Too Many Looks In Your Eyes," the Hollies' "Curly Billy Brill" and "Forgive Me."

Before Gibb performed his chart-topping "I Just Want To Be Your Everything." RSO president Al Coury and chairman of the board Robert Stigwood came onstage to present Gibb with his first gold single. When the applause quieted, Gibb climaxed the show with "I Just Want To Be Your Everything."

He returned for an encore doing the Beatles'
"It's Getting Better" that did justice to the original version.

The material Gibb is working with is all mainstream pop with high commercial appeal. With time, maturation and his brothers' influences and encouragement, Gibb should sustain a long and successful carrer. ED HARRISON

GLADYS KNIGHT & THE PIPS RAY CHARLES

Greek Theatre, Los Angeles

For nearly two hours and 22 songs Knight and associates backed by a full orchestra maintained total control of an almost full house Sept.

Impressively contoured, often flashing lights framed the singers as in a television variety scene.

The concert, which was taped for pay cable to by Home Box Office, offered both Gladys and the Pips a chance to perform together and separately.

The group came onstage with a bouncy "How Can You Say I Don't Love You" seguing smoothly into "I Feel A Song In My Heart." Although the group is going in different directions as to labels, the Pips with Casablanca and Gladys with Buddah, as a team it has never been better.

Going down memory lane, Knight scored with the group's first hit "Every Beat Of My Heart." receiving rousing applause.

From its newest Buddah LP, "Gladys Knight & The Pips Still Together," the ensemble gave up "No Changes." The tone of its repertoire was to set different moods. Its aim was to take the audience on a totally diverse musical trip.

From the "Claudine" LP the group performed "On And On," and from "Pipe Dreams." "So Sad The Song." Gladys has developed into a smooth, slick stage personality with patter and presence to equal the choreography of the Pips.

"I Don't Wanna Do Wrong." had Knight at her strongest but the audience also enjoyed "You're The Best Thing That Ever Happened To Me" and "Midnight Train To Georgia."

As the group left the stage, a standing ovation brought back the Pips to do their own solo thing. The background trio offered the crowd a glimpse of what to-expect if it moves onto perform minus Gladys.

As the Pips went into a production number "Street Brothers" with tight harmony to an ever so loose uptempo, semi-novelty tune, the crowd went wild. Each member showcased his own individual talents in this one.

Knight took the same opportunity to go solo. taking "Second Hand Rose" and transforming it into "Second Hand Song," followed by a short monolog on Barbra Streisand which led to "Evergreen" and smoothly into "The Way We Were." The house was on its feet.

As the entire group slid into "Use My Imagination" and "I Heard It Through The Grapevine," a piano was brought onstage to the surprise of the audience. The crowd had not been advised of Ray Charles' appearance.

Charles, who was recently reviewed here, took the stage with his Raelettes for the next 35 minutes. He was rejoined onstage by Knight for

a Charles-proven winner "Georgia."

Ray in his gospel-like fashion handled the keyboards with accompanying vocals for Gladys and the Pips on "Daddy Could Swear." "Neither One Of Us." "Hit The Road Jack." "Keep Me Singing" and "What I Say."

The Boarding House, San Francisco

Gayle, a young woman who on every account is a most attractive performer, filled this 300-seat room to capacity for her four shows on her two night Sept. 17-18 engagement.

She is one of the few performers ever to play the Boarding House who would be equally at home in a Las Vegas setting, and her appearance drew many middle aged fans who normally do not frequent this club.

She rewarded them with a set of 14 tunes, which were preceded by her backing band doing several introductory numbers of its own. The entire program consumed about 90 mintues.

Crystal's best asset—as it should be for any singer—is her voice, which on several tunes like "I'll Get Over You" and "Got My Sweet Baby On My Mind" she really let stretch out.

Though some of her stage patter was a touch on the saccharine side, she is basically solid, composed and appealing in her presence and mannerisms.

Her set opened with "Love The Night Away." followed by two well known songs. "Rolling In My Sweet Baby's Arms" and the softer ballad "Rodeo." a song best known in the Judy Collins version.

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
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Mushroom Can Release Masters Of Meart Songs

HOTLINE TIPS Gibb Single On Top 10 Weeks

LOS ANGELES-Andy Gibb's "I Just Want To Be Your Everything" (RSO) this week becomes only the second single in the history of the Hot 100 to spend as many as 15 consecutive weeks in the top 10.

The only record which has had as

many weeks in the top 10 in the history of the survey, which dates back to 1958, is Bobby Darin's "Mack The Knife" (Atco), which had 16 top 10 weeks in 1959 and went on to be the No. I single of the year.

The consecutive distinction is the key here, as Chubby Checker's "The Twist" (Parkway) actually had 25 weeks in the top 10: 12 weeks in its initial run in 1960 and another 13 weeks in its re-release in 1961-62.

On the album chart, Fleetwood Mac's "Rumours" (WB) remains on top for the 22nd week, which is now the longest a contemporary rock act has ever stayed at No. I. Elvis Presley's "Blue Hawaii" (RCA Victor) from 1961-62 is second with 20 weeks.

The only albums which have remained at No. I longer in the rock era are soundtracks and MOR re-leases: the "West Side Story" soundtrack on Columbia (54 weeks at No. 1 in 1962-63), the "South Pacific" soundtrack on RCA Victor (31 weeks in 1958) and Harry Bela-fonte's "Calypso" on RCA (31 weeks in 1956-57).

These findings are culled from Hotline, a publication which includes chart analysis and the pop. soul, country and MOR charts, and which is sent out a few days in advance of the regular Billboard issue.


Boston Sued By Elf Management

Film Firm Slapped By Judge's Ruling

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




