

EFFECT OF IMMIGRATION LAWS ON PERMITS TO REMAIN

A Remedy Permit has no effect under the Immigration Laws except to show that the person to whom issued is returning from a temporary absence, and, where him or the necessity of securing a visa from an American Consul before returning to the United States. It does not relieve him from meeting the other requirements of the immigration laws, either criminal or ministerial, prevailing at the time of his departure, unless otherwise provided by law. Other conditions, however, imposed by the Immigration or Naturalization Service, and others found to be in violation of the laws, may be remedied if circumstances so require, notwithstanding they may also in particular affect the holder.

EFFECT OF A REMEDY PERMIT UPON NATIONALIZATION ELIGIBILITY

This permit does not affect the permanent location of the nationalization laws, for which continuous residence in the United States is required for admission to citizenship. An application for a Remedy Permit will not affect the right of the holder to become a citizen of the United States, or to receive a certificate of naturalization, granted by the Attorney General, or by the Secretary of State, or by the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, in whole or in part, in the development of foreign trade and commerce of the United States or of a subsidiary thereof. Such approval should be applied for in Form N-70, "Application for Remedy of Sec. 407(b) or 408, Nationality Act of 1905," available at any immigration or naturalization office. 

EFFECT UNDER IMMIGRATION LAW

A Reentry permit has no effect under the immigration laws except to allow him to reenter the United States and relieve him of the necessity of securing a visa from an American Consul before returning to the United States. AWES OF PERMIT TO REENTER

Notwithstanding the possession of a reentry permit, absence from the United States by an applicant for naturalization for a continuous period of one year or more during the period for which continuous residence in the United States is required for admission to citizenship will break the continuity of such residence, except where, prior thereto, the Attorney General has approved an absence in the employment of, or under contract with, the United States Government or an American institution of research recognized as such by the Attorney General, or in the employment of an American firm or corporation engaged in whole or in part in the development of foreign trade and commerce of the United States or a subsidiary thereof. Procedure for Obtaining Information From Immigration and
Naturalization Records

1. The records of this Service are held to be confidential. However, information from the records may be furnished in the discretion of the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D.C., where not prejudicial to the Government or the public interest. Persons, except Government officials, desiring such information must submit sworn application setting forth (1) their interest, (2) the reason the information is desired, and (3) the purpose for which it is to be used, with such other evidence as the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization may require. The Alien Registration Act provides that all registration and fingerprint records made under the provisions of that act shall be secret and confidential and shall be made available only to such persons or agencies as may be designated by the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization with the approval of the Attorney General. Existing laws and regulations require payment of a minimum fee of fifty cents (50¢), for furnishing information from official records of the Service, to be remitted by postal money order, payable to the Treasurer of the United States, New York, N. Y.

2. Records prior to July 1, 1924, of arriving aliens are kept at the various ports of entry and not in the Central Office. To locate such a record it is usually necessary to have complete information as to the name under which the person was admitted with exact spelling and month and year of entry, name of the steamship, and port of arrival. It is especially necessary that such information be furnished if entry occurred prior to July 1, 1902. Records of arrivals at New York prior to June 15, 1897, are on file in The National Archives, Washington, D.C., and communications concerning information desired from such records should be addressed to that agency and not to the Immigration and Naturalization Service. It will be of assistance in locating records of early arrivals to show the nationality of the persons concerned and the names of the ports from which they embarked for the United States. Records of entry on the Canadian border, prior to 1903, and on the Mexican border, prior to 1908, are not available. Records of departing aliens are on file only at the ports of departure, and usually do not antedate March 1, 1929. It is necessary to know the port, name of the steamship, and date of departure in order to locate such a record.

3. Immigration records of arrivals prior to July 1, 1924, do not show the date of birth of the person concerned but merely the age as stated at the time of arrival. Subsequent to June 30, 1924, dates of birth are shown only in certain records relating to admissions for permanent residence.

4. An alien resident of the United States (other than one ineligible to citizenship) who desires an American consul to be furnished with information as to his lawful admission to this country for permanent residence, for use in connection with the application of a relative for an immigration visa under the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, may execute Form I-475 (old Form 575). Such forms may be obtained from any office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, or from the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C. The form should be made out and filed in strict accordance with the instructions thereon.

5. It is generally necessary in order to locate and identify a naturalization record to have the name and location of the court for which naturalization was granted and the approximate date of naturalization and some identifying information, such as date and place of birth and, if married, name of husband or wife and names of children. Information as to the name and location of the court in which admitted to citizenship, or at least information as to the places of residence in the United States of the person concerned and the dates between which he resided in each place, is absolutely necessary if the naturalization occurred prior to September 27, 1906, as the only records of persons naturalized prior to that date are those on file in the respective courts.

6. Persons who desire information from the records for use in immigration or naturalization applications should execute to the best of their ability the appropriate application form which may be obtained from any field office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, from the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C., or, in the case of naturalization applications, from clerks of naturalization courts. The Immigration and Naturalization Service does not furnish information from its records for use in executing applications; however, appropriate searches are conducted upon the basis of information furnished in applications which have been executed as completely as possible and submitted to the Service.

7. Persons desiring verification of citizenship, age, or legal residence in the United States for use in applying for old-age pension or public assistance of any kind should communicate with the nearest office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Form G-78 may be used in such cases without being sworn to.






