Aliens absent in the capacity of a regularly ordained clergyman or nun are also eligible to make such application.

**PENALTY FOR FALSE STATEMENTS**

Whoever knowingly makes under oath any false statement in any application, affidavit, or other document required by the immigration laws or regulations prescribed thereunder, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both. (Sec. 22, Act of May 26, 1924, 43 Stat. 153, Sec. 220.)

**EXTENSIONS**

The validity of a permit may, on good cause shown, be extended for a period or periods not exceeding 6 months each. Application for extension should be made between 30 and 60 days prior to the expiration date shown on this permit. The permit, if extended, will be returned to the foreign address given in the application. Where the validity of the permit or extension thereto has expired, the alien must obtain an immigration visa from an American Consul before embarking for the United States.

However, you will be required to present these cards when you appear to file your petition for naturalization and to surrender them at the time you are admitted to citizenship. You should therefore carefully save your Immigrant Identification Card and your Alien Registration Receipt Card.

Photographs.—You are required to send with this application three photographs of yourself taken within 30 days of the date of this application. These photographs must be 2 by 2 inches in size, and the distance from top of head to point of chin should be approximately 1 1/4 inches. They must not be pasted on the cards or mounted in any other way, must be on thin paper, have a light background, and clearly show a front view of your face without hat. Snapshots, group or full-length portraits will not be accepted. Both of these photographs must be signed by you on the margin and not on the face or the clothing.

Date of Your Arrival.—If you do not know the exact date of your arrival in the United States, or the name of the vessel or port, and you cannot obtain this information by consulting your family or friends who came over with you, give the facts of your arrival as you remember them in the appropriate blank spaces on the first page of this form. Your Immigrant Identification Card or your passport, ship's card, or baggage labels, if you have them, may help you to answer these questions.

If the date of your arrival in the United States was on or before June 29, 1906, you should submit with this application documentary evidence of your residence in the United States prior to that date. Such documents may be family bible entries, deeds of record, wills or other authentic legal documents, life insurance policies, bank books and records, employment records or other documents showing that you entered the United States on or before June 29, 1906. Do not submit such documents if your arrival in the United States was after June 29, 1906.

Absence from the United States.—In statement No. 5 on page 1 of this form, show ALL of your absences from the United States, regardless of how long you were away. In statement No. 12 on page 3, show only your absences which were for 6 or more months. Absence from the United States for more than 6 months but less than 1 year during the periods of continuous residence required in the United States may break the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes. An absence from the United States of 1 year or more during such periods will break the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes, except that after you have resided in the United States for at least 1 year and have filed a declaration of intention, if your absence abroad is made necessary because you are an employee of the United States Government, an American institution of research, or an American firm or corporation engaged in foreign trade and commerce of the United States, you may prevent a break in the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes by making an application on Form N-470. For complete information you should address the office of this Service nearest to you, or the "Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Philadelphia, Pa."

Nationality and Race.—Nationality in statement No. 6, page 3, refers to the country of which you are a citizen or subject. As to "race" in the same statement, Section 303 of the Nationality Act of 1940 provides that only white persons, persons of African nativity or descent, and descendants of races indigenous to the Western Hemisphere are eligible for naturalization. There are certain exceptions in the case of native-born Filipinos who have served honorably in the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard for a period of at least 3 years, and in the cases of women who have lost citizenship through marriage.

As stated above, the following races are eligible for naturalization: White, "A native" African or African descent, Filipino. State to which of these classifications you belong.

**Procedure for Obtaining Information From Immigration and  
Naturalization Records**

1. The records of this Service are held to be confidential. However, information from the records may be furnished in the discretion of the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D.C., where not prejudicial to the Government or the public interest. Persons, except Government officials, desiring such information must submit sworn application setting forth (1) their interest, (2) the reason the information is desired, and (3) the purpose for which it is to be used, with such other evidence as the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization may require. The Alien Registration Act provides that all registration and fingerprint records made under the provisions of that act shall be secret and confidential and shall be made available only to such persons or agencies as may be designated by the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization with the approval of the Attorney General. Existing law and regulations require payment of a minimum fee of fifty cents (50¢), for furnishing information from official records of the Service, to be remitted by postal money order, payable to the Treasurer of the United States, New York, N. Y.

2. Records prior to July 1, 1924, of arriving aliens are kept at the various ports of entry and not in the Central Office. To locate such a record it is usually necessary to have complete information as to the name under which the person was admitted with exact spelling and month and year of entry, name of the steamship and port of arrival. It is especially necessary that such information be furnished if entry occurred prior to July 1, 1902. Records of arrivals at New York prior to June 15, 1897, are on file in The National Archives, Washington, D.C., and communications concerning information desired from such records should be addressed to that agency and not to the Immigration and Naturalization Service. It will be of assistance in locating records of early arrivals to show the nationality of the persons concerned and the names of the ports from which they embarked for the United States. Records of entry on the Canadian border, prior to 1903, and on the Mexican border, prior to 1908, are not available. Records of departing aliens are on file only at the ports of departure and usually do not antedate March 1, 1929. It is necessary to know the port, name of the steamship, and date of departure in order to locate such a record.

3. Immigration records of arrivals prior to July 1, 1924, do not show the date of birth of the person concerned but merely the age as stated at the time of arrival. Subsequent to June 30, 1924, dates of birth have shown only in certain records relating to admissions for permanent residence.

4. An alien resident of the United States (other than one ineligible to citizenship) who desires an American consul to be furnished with information as to his lawful admission to this country for permanent residence, for use in connection with the application of a relative for an Immigration Visa under the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, may execute Form I-475 (old Form 575). Such forms may be obtained from any office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, or from the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C. The form should be made out and filed in strict accordance with the instructions thereon.

5. It is generally necessary in order to locate and identify a naturalization record to have the name and location of the court in which naturalization was granted and the approximate date of naturalization and some identifying information, such as date and place of birth and, if married, name of husband or wife and names of children. Information as to the name and location of the court in which admitted to citizenship, or at least information as to the places of residence in the United States of the person concerned and the dates between which he resided in each place, is absolutely necessary if the naturalization occurred prior to September 27, 1906, as the only records of persons naturalized prior to that date are those on file in the respective courts.

6. Persons who desire information from the records for use in immigration or naturalization applications should execute to the best of their ability the appropriate application form which may be obtained from any field office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, from the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C., or, in the case of naturalization applications, from clerks of naturalization courts. The Immigration and Naturalization Service does not furnish information from its records for use in executing applications; however, appropriate searches are conducted upon the basis of information furnished in applications which have been executed as completely as possible and submitted to the Service.

7. Persons desiring verification of citizenship, age, or legal residence in the United States for use in applying for old-age pension or public assistance of any kind should communicate with the nearest office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Form G-79 may be used in such cases without being sworn to.

### Information Concerning Reporting by Immigrant Displaced Persons

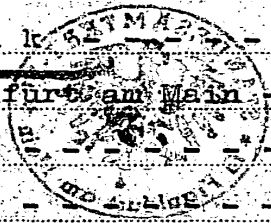

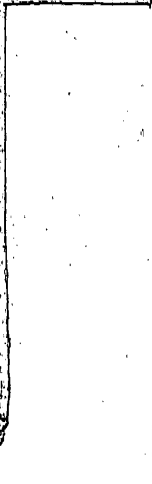
